




Remote School







The West40 Educator Licensure Team supports teachers, paraprofessionals, substitute teachers, school support personnel and administrators with navigating the sometimes complex landscape of licensure. The team responds to thousands of inquiries which can include questions from educators and retirees relocating to Illinois from other states or countries.

West40 hosts an annual Educator Job Fair that connects the West40 school districts with prospective educators seeking job opportunities.

West40 also hosts a monthly HR Network meeting for all West40 school district HR personnel, fostering collaboration and sharing resources relating to licensure and employment.

STANDING FOR STUDENTS IN SPRINGFIELD


West40's legislative efforts continued in Springfield during the 2024-25 school year. This included advocating for increased Evidence-Based Funding and seeing the approval of a bill we championed two years ago to streamline the process for ROEs and ISCs to become learning partners in the Statewide System of Support. Our efforts to expand K-3 ALOPs statewide nearly passed but was shelved at the last moment. While West40 was able to secure a School Code waiver which allows us to provide K-3 ALOP services, we are hopeful that the bill will come up again in a future legislative session so that all regions of the state can offer this service.



COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

Throughout the 2024-25 school year, West40's Communications Team contracted with five educational and non-profit partners to produce multi-video projects. The team also coordinated all of West40's internal and external communications, social media, and marketing campaigns and was honored for its creativity by the National School Public Relations Association. Additionally, we kicked off a series of workshops designed specifically for area school communications professionals, district administrators and non-profit organizations. Topics included the importance of building partnerships with local first responders and effective crisis communications with the media.

FISCAL AGENT FOR OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

West40 is the fiscal agent for Philip J. Rock Center & School in Glen Ellyn and this year we oversaw nearly \$5.4 million in funds. Additionally, West40 processed \$6.1 million from the funds we oversee for 600+ nonpublic schools in the EANS (Emergency Assistance to Nonpublic Schools) program and more than \$2.3 million for the Midwest Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports Network.

EMPLOYABILITY

Our Employability Program helps students build confidence, discover purpose, and prepare for what's next. A total of 12 middle and high school students from the West40 Safe School and Remote School completed internships this past year and we also created experiences that let students see careers they may not have imagined for themselves. This included field trips and on-site visits to colleges, internships, and work placements so students can connect what they're learning to the real world.

PAINTED LADY BUTTERFLIES

West40 distributed 866 Painted Lady Butterfly kits to school districts, private schools and day cares throughout the region. This tradition started 36 years ago and provides a way for

students and families to enjoy and learn about natural sciences.

Our Financials

West40 receives revenue from Federal and State grants as well as from contracts with the State of Illinois. Our Professional Development, Communications, and Comprehensive Educational Services teams contract with the school districts and communities we serve to provide services and training. Additionally, West40 collects fees for testing services, background checks, and licensure. The West40 Grants Team successfully secured \$8.1 million in state and federal funding for FY25. This total includes four new competitive awards, reinforcing West40's leadership in advancing innovative, equity-driven educational initiatives across the region.

Our largest source of revenue comes from Evidence-Based Funding (EBF) for Alternative Learning Opportunities Programs (ALOP) and our Regional Safe School. Our ALOP program continues to grow in enrollment from year to year. This growth in enrollment increases our EBF funding, allowing us to serve more students designated by our districts as being at-risk of not graduating. The increase in student population as well as a significant increase in local and state contracts has necessitated growth in our staff and for FY26 we will employ close to 275 employees.

The \$9M debt certificate issued in May 2023 to fund renovations at both our Lexington campus and St. Joseph has been paid in full as of May 2025. Despite this large payment made in FY25 (\$9.8M in principal and interest), our ending fund balance increased by 13%. Facility projects will continue in FY26 with a complete tear-out and replacement of our Lexington parking lot that will include new fencing, a student drop-off lane, and an ADA compliant main entrance. New classroom doors are being installed in the safe school, partially funded by the School Maintenance Grant. Planning continues for the St. Joseph property, with construction projects completed as funding becomes available.
